Virtual Vital Conversation meeting via Teams held on Wednesday, March 3, 2021 at 12:00 pm. The goal of this Vital Conversation is to give youth (ages 15 to 29) in Altona and the Municipality of Rhineland an opportunity to speak on key issues currently facing the area, and how we can address those moving forward.

Present were: RBC community manager, Curtis Sanjenko; ACF president, Chris Sumner; ACF vice-president Loren Braul, ACF board reps, Bill Penner and Tracy Klassen, Youth For Christ (YFC) directors, Sheridan Sawatzky and Marty Falk; YFC youth reps, Christopher Dixon and Hudson Giesbrecht; W.C. Miller Collegiate youth reps, Willow Kehler, Zaenab Ali, and Mackenzie Friesen; and Town of Altona rep, mayor Al Friesen.

Welcome - Chris Sumner, ACF president

Chris Sumner welcomed everyone to the meeting.

RBC Future Launch Community Challenge was a call for action for youth, aged 15-29 in communities across Canada. In each partnering community, youth and partner organizations (ACF) had the opportunity to apply for a grant to support a youth-led project.

ACF entered into collaboration with Community Foundations of Canada (CFC) for the purposes of delivering the RBC Future Launch Community Challenge and were allocated \$15,000 and was responsible for selecting local projects that comply with the eligibility criteria for the RBC Future Launch Community Challenge and for making the final grants.

In fall of 2019 Youth for Christ - Altona submitted their online grant applications and was awarded the RBC grant of \$15,000 to develop their "Maker Space"

Welcome - Curtis Sanjenko, RBC community manager

We want to continue to work together with youth to prepare them for their future in these changing times. RBC Future Launch is proud to support services and opportunities in our communities especially with the adapting and resiliency of the past year. Thanks to everyone that participated in the RBC Future Launch

Youth for Christ grant recipient - Sheridan Sawatzky and Marty Falk

Youth for Christ is a youth center in Altona dedicated to providing a safe and inviting place for teens. We were looking at restructing our programming to a focused space "Maker Space" where teens could get the opportunity to build and create using the latest technology that could lead them on a path for possible future careers, or a new artistic outlet, but we didn't have the funding. Through this grant we were able to purchase a 3D printer, laser engravers, power tools and more.

Funding from this grant put us on a path to develop the Maker Space and get more youth involved.

Youth needed something tangelible, a place to try or develop new skills.

The Maker Space also opened up a new volunteer base at the YFC. We are bringing in volunteers that have skills to teach the youth how to use the equipment we were able to purchase for the Maker Space. We were recently allowed to have five teens back in the building again.

Big plans are in the works for 2021 and we are excited about the future of the Maker Space.

- Youth are struggling with a sense of community. Hopefully with the warmer weather there will be more opportunities to engage as a community.
- Hard to be motivated, not knowing what you're working towards.

Christopher Dixon, YFC youth rep

- Hard to find motivation and find that sense of community. Not easy when you go to school every other day. Before everything shut down I felt I fit in at the Maker Space, nice to have that creative outlet. I enjoyed working with the 3D printer and had gotten into coding. Had just started using the CNC to mill wood before everything was shut down. Will be nice when the Maker Space is accessible again.
- This meeting was eye opening, good to hear of other youth struggling. Maybe there is something we can do together – movie in the park?

Mackenzie Friesen, W.C. Miller student rep and Municipality of Rhineland youth rep

- Feeling a lack of community, feeling separated. Youth need to feel connected. Hopefully the warmer weather will allow community to come together more.
- I don't live in Altona and I know the struggle of poor internet. Maybe we can plan a community event like a food drive?

Hudson Giesbrecht - W.C. Miller student rep

- It's hard for me to connect with people. Before COVID the Maker Space helped me connect with kids I didn't know. I enjoyed helping assemble the computers, 3D printer, etc. in the Maker Space.
- Encouraging to hear YFC is opening its doors with restrictions.

Zaenab Ali - W.C. Miller student rep and town council student rep

- Youth are struggling with lack of motivation and feeling that sense of community. Discouraged with the lack of accessibility to internet and devices. They recently conducted a survey and 50% of the student body reported a lack of internet accessibility. Hopefully we can plan some outdoor activities as a community with the current COVID restrictions.
- Same thoughts as Willow.

Final thoughts - Al Friesen - mayor of Altona

As board member of Blue Sky Opportunities we are having a hard time filling orders for our crokinole boards. We are exploring a partnership with YFC to help us fill our orders.

Final thoughts - Loren Braul - vice-president of ACF

On behalf of ACF we are proud of the strong relationship we have built with the Youth in Philanthropy student council and YFC. We are excited to hear on how the Maker Space has helped youth of our community.

Final thoughts - Curtis Sanjenko - RBC community manager

I would like to share with youth that you're not alone. 82 per cent of our staff works at home, and it's hard - we all miss that social interaction and sense of community. Good to have a discussion about mental health. Encourage youth to reach out via Zoom, etc. – you can be that social connector. If you experience downs, I encourage you to seek mental assistance.

Take aways from Sheridan & Marty

Something that is always tangible is random acts of kindness. It's important to let teens know we are thinking of them. Maybe we can explore the option of bringing lemonade to school one day as a random act of kindness.

In response to the food drive, YFC has a new van available for pick-ups or deliveries – let us know how we can help.

Maybe we can make it work that teens use our space at YFC for internet to get school work done.

Chris took a virtual group photo and thanked everyone for taking the time to have this conversation.

The conversation and comments from youth were fantastic and you all did a phenomenal job!
